Exploration Revealed is a hybrid publication —the editors invite both magazine articles and peer-reviewed academic articles, simultaneously revealing and advancing the science* of expeditioning. We seek:

- magazine articles ranging between 300-800 words, according to the maximum limit specified per section
- peer-reviewed academic articles for any section, a maximum of 1500 words, you submit, we organize the double-blind peer review and plagiarism check

*including traditional knowledge, knowledge of indigenous peoples and local knowledge systems.

TALES FROM THE FIELD (max 800 words)

Reflections over field research career to date on the highs and lows on life indoors and out in the field

TOP KIT TIPS (max 300 words)

Real experiences in different environs with kit that supports activities relevant to SES awards -can vary from scientific to filming equipment. Authors must not be in receipt of sponsored equipment and/or in a contract with the kit supplier

INNOVATION IN THE FIELD (max 800 words)

From innovations in technology to techniques - encouraging cross disciplinary sharing

EXPEDITION REVEALED (max 800 words)

What went on, highs and lows, the inspirational aspects/scientific trailblazing attributes. We'd like to hear about the preparation - was there an ethics review process and other professions relied on e.g. entomologists, archaeobotanists, geologists, fixers. We welcome articles from the SES Explorer Award for Inspirational and Scientific Trailblazing.

EXTREME EXPEDITIONING (max 800 words)

Personal accounts of endurance and experiences expeditionining in extreme conditions, whether for adventure of science. We welcome articles from SES Sir Charles Bloyce Exploer Award winners.

CLIMATE SENSITIVE EXPEDITIONING (max 800 words)

Action planned and taken to reduce greenhouse gas emissions generated and/or to build in resilience and adaption to climate variability and change.

EPIC FAILS (max 300 words)

From blunder to catastrophe, a chance to help others to learn from your experience and for the public to value the trials and tribulations involved. Can be submitted anonymously, but editors will need to fact check.

EXPEDITION LOGISTICS (max 800 words)

What went on, highs and lows, was there an ethics review process and other professions relied on e.g. entomologists, archaeobotanists

IN-COUNTRY CONNECTIONS (max 300 words)

This can include articles on team working, working with host country organisations, fixers, collaboration, knowledge exchange, academic lingo of knowledge coproduction

EXPEDITION IMPACT (max 800 words)

The ways in which expeditions can advance education, relieve poverty and sickness and, or help with wildlife, flora and/or fauna in the localities and countries visited, drawing on real life experience during and after the expedition. This could include methods and theories tested, what worked, what didn't in reality. We welcome images and articles from SES Elodie Sandford, SES Judith Heath and SES Gough Explorer Award winners.

YOUNG SCIENTIFIC EXPLORERS (max 500 words)

Do you have an explorer you'd like to interview? Or perhaps facts you've discovered and would like to share. Send us your interview requests, articles, drawings and, or photos and we'll do the rest! This section is for young people under the age of 18 and we'll need to check your submission with a responsible adult, either a family member/guardian or a teacher.

MIND MATTERS & BODILY FUNCTIONS IN THE FIELD (max 800 words)

What goes on in the field often doesn't need to stay in the field. Help others to learn from your health and wellbeing experiences whilst on expedition.
